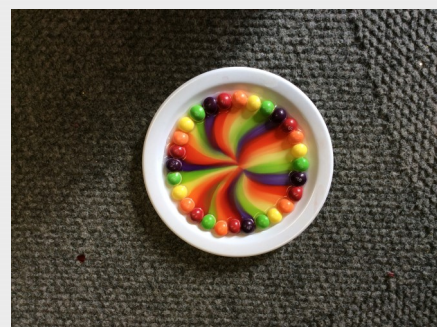
Children's Bingo—Wednesday 29 March
