**£5 a ticket which includes 3 rounds of bingo and kids dinner**

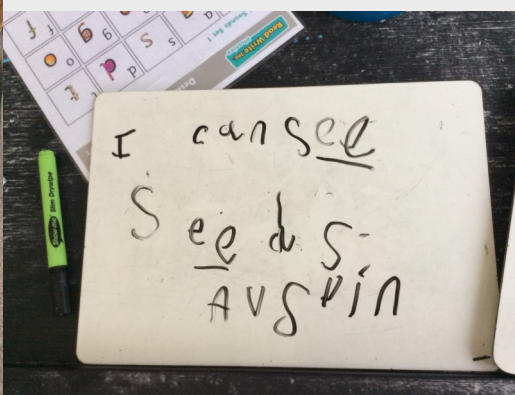

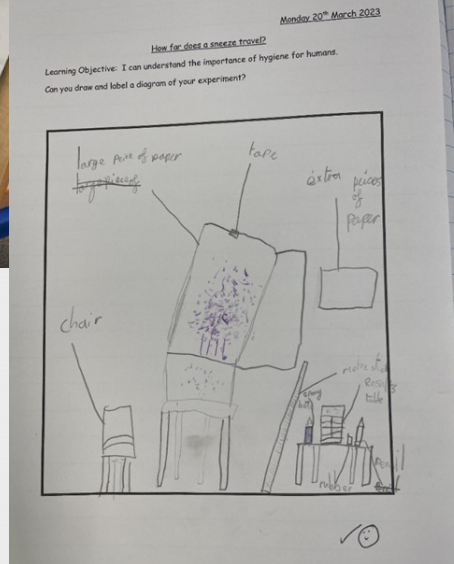

## Class 2 Horner News

In Science we have been learning about germs and how they spread. This week we observed how far a sneeze travelled using a spray bottle and large sheets of paper. The children had a great time and learnt about the importance of sneezing into a tissue to stop germs spreading. We recorded our results in a table and drew a labelled diagram of our science experiment.



Monday 20<sup>th</sup> March 2023

How far does a sneeze travel?

Learning Objective: I can observe how far a sneeze can travel.

Distance	Observational Notes
94cm	Interestingly it the sneeze got all the way to the back
15cm 74cm	Instead that the sneeze got 15cm further than most of the dots on the first one
24cm	The sneeze is 27cm across/wide
4cm	It turning down the paper!
1cm	I counted how long it got to the bottom 13 seconds
3cm	There are lots of little dots
40cm	It got little end with big dots
