We're finding out all about the fascinating world of ancient Egypt through our guided reading and history work. The class have put in a request for another living history day - an excellent idea!



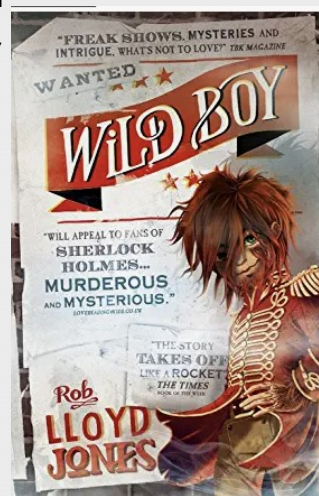

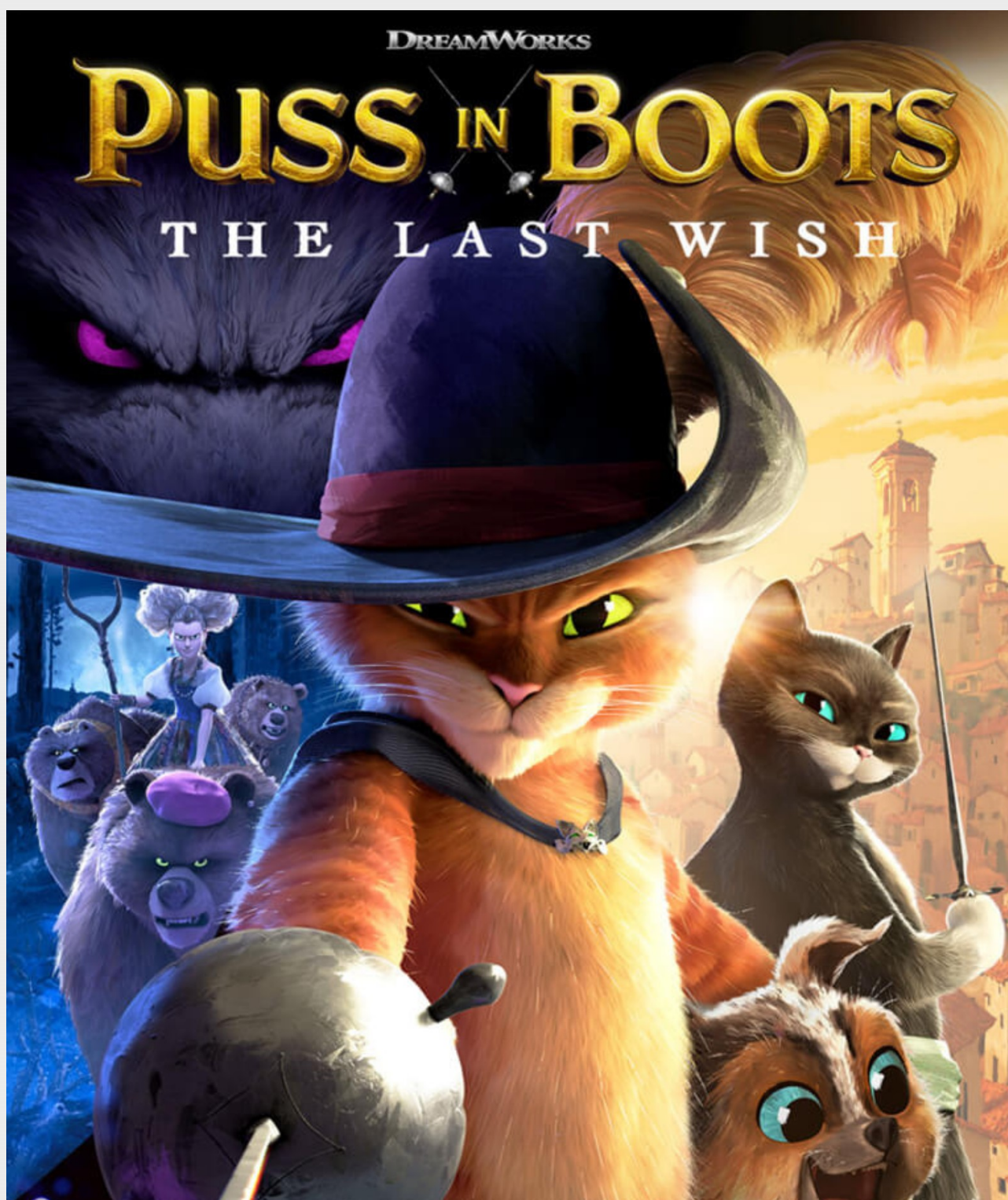
GOREN FESTIVAL

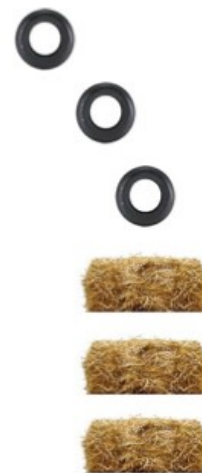
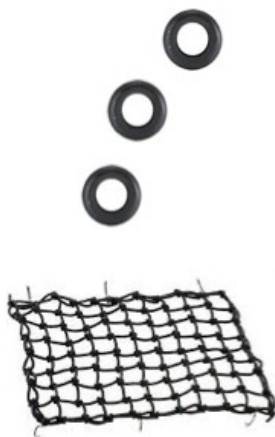
