Our statutory assessment data is very impressive across the school. 93% of children passed the phonics screening test. 82% of children in Year 4 showed a good level of recall in their Multiplication Tables Check-up from 45% last year.

We couldn't ask for more! All of our children experienced so many fun opportunities and experiences this year. 

Unlock digital badges and online rewards, including a printable certificate.


