Duck Race



Class 2 outside space - DIY helpers needed in summer




Class 1 Featherlake News






Our geography lesson on Wednesday proved to be a real 'head scratcher' as we tackled identifying oceans, countries and cities by their coordinates. It was a challenge, but everyone was using the lines of longitude and latitude confidently by the end of the lesson.

If you were able to join us for the open-morning today, you will have spotted the stunning artwork Quantock has produced. These pieces were the culmination of several weeks of exploring different techniques in order to create lovely still-life collages inspired by the artist Cezanne.




