Tiny Travels visiting Wednesday 29th November Years R—4

We have booked a company called Tiny Travels to visit Years R-4 on Wednesday 29th November.

Tiny Travels gives children a fully immersive, fun opportunity to learn about cultures around the world. They offer global learning through sensory exploration. Tiny Travels believes in amplifying historically marginalised voices. It is important that children learn about the true aspects of a country and not an idea of what the culture looks like, therefore they have hired women from all around the world to create the resources they will bring to school.

Annual nasal flu vaccination - Years R—6 (inclusive)

The School Age Immunisation Service will be visiting the school on **Monday 4th December**. In 2023/24 all children in Primary Schools from Reception to year 6 (inclusive) will be offered the vaccine. The vaccination is free and recommended for young children; it is administered by a quick and simple spray up the nose. The school will be visited on **Monday 4th December**. Class 1 Featherlake News


