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Tiny Travels visiting Wednesday 29th November Years R—4

We have booked a company called Tiny Travels to visit Years R-4 on Wednesday 29th November.

Tiny Travels gives children a fully immersive, fun opportunity to learn about cultures around the world. They offer global learning through sensory exploration. Tiny Travels believes in amplifying historically marginalised voices. It is important that children learn about the true aspects of a country and not an idea of what the culture looks like, therefore they have hired women from all around the world to create the resources they will bring to school.

Youth Club

Please note that: the timings of the sessions are not the length of time children are spent in a lesson. This includes continuous provision time/group work after the input has been delivered.

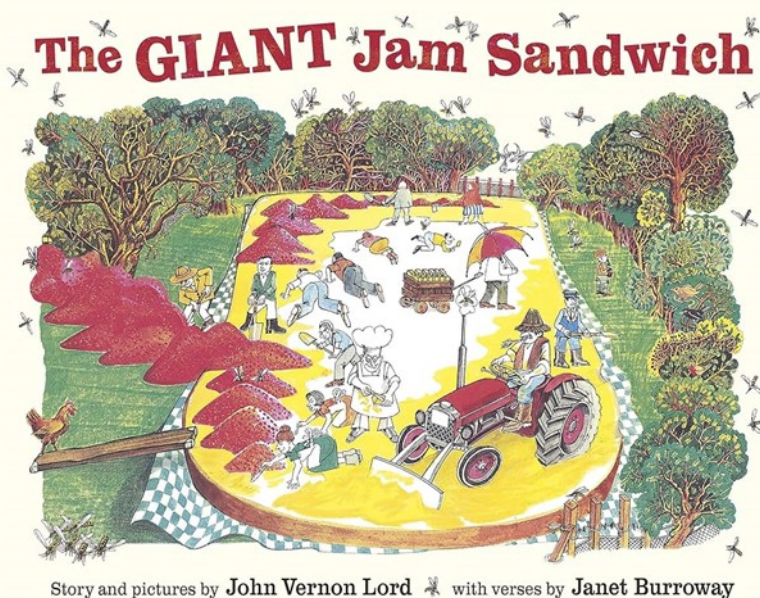
Class 2 Horner News

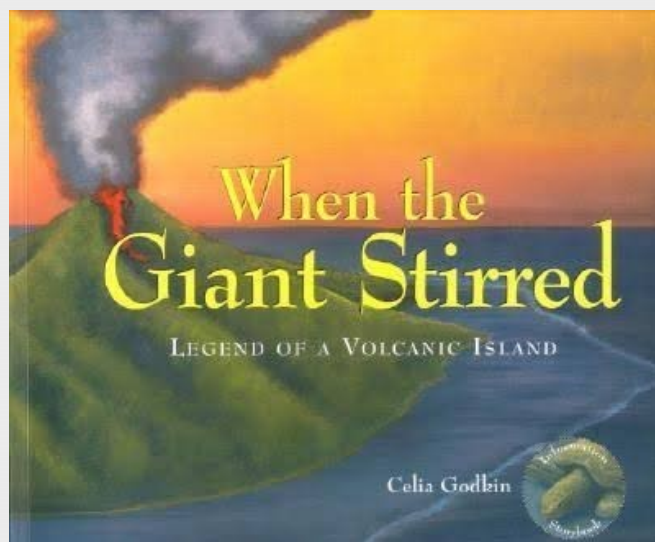

On Monday afternoon, we tested our aqueducts. There was much excitement as we poured water down each pair's construction. Fortunately, the Romans clearly left us a great legacy in building and construction ideas as we had almost a 100% success rate! Our new art topic focuses on the use of charcoal to create gestural drawings. We explored the work of Laura McKendry and Edgar Degas, both experts in the use of charcoal and we look forward to sharing our own interpretations with you later in the term.
