It is important that children learn about the true aspects of a country and not an idea of what the culture looks like, therefore they have hired women from all around the world to create the resources they will bring to school.

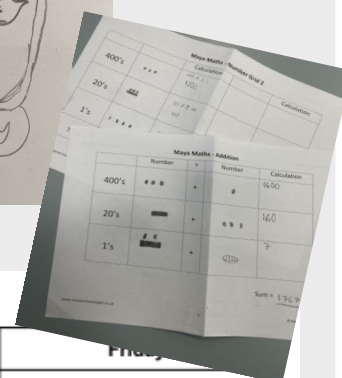
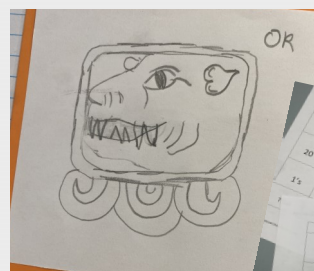
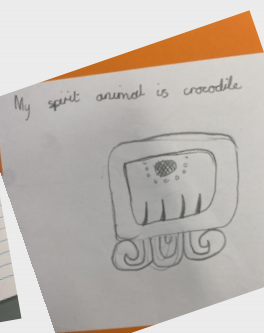
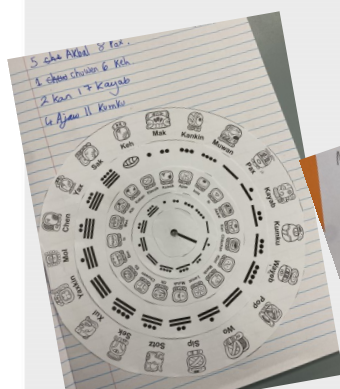


## Class 4 Bucehayes News

We have had a super week including a special History Day on the ancient Maya where we learnt about the Maya number system, their calendar, our spirit animals and had a quiz on identifying Maya Artefacts using all the information we had learnt about them, working as Archaeologists. We had access to amazing videos from Dr Diane Davies the Maya Archaeologist explaining all these aspects and showing what it is like working in the Rainforests of Central America discovering more all the time about the Maya.

We have been learning about our poem flanders field and are also able to recite and sing the poem off by heart beautifully. I will share a recording next week and we will be including a recording of it in the Stockland time capsule alongside our drawings and writings about current day Stockland School.

Yesterday, most of us enjoyed dancing to the music of Glenn Miller's Band as part of our learning about that era of music, the instruments used, the style of the music. We also learnt about the chromatic scale. We are learning to sing Hey Mister Miller as part of this unit.
